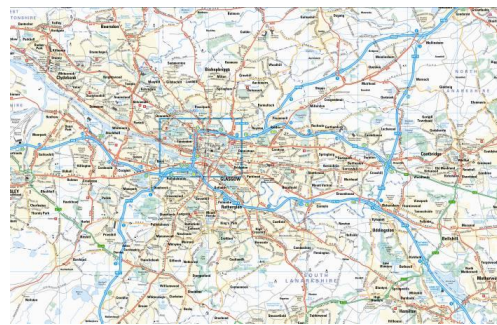
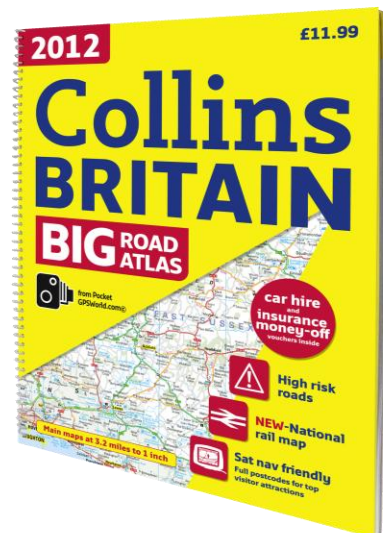

- 30 different categories for 'places of interest' detailed in the maps, including: castles, theme parks, sports venues, universities, mountain bike trails and surfing beaches
- In addition, the Atlas includes a National Rail Map and full postcodes for the top 1000 destination sites in the United Kingdom, which is ideal for use alongside satnav systems
- Major road updates including: Glasgow's recently opened M74 extension; the M80 (Glasgow-Stirling) due to open shortly; the soon-to-open A3 Hindhead tunnel; and the A487 Porthmadog bypass, which is going to open later this year
- This Atlas also contains something entirely unique: to mark the 25th anniversary of the release of Hollywood blockbuster 'Highlander' (which first introduced the world to immortal hero Connor MacLeod), Collins launched a competition offering a member of the public the opportunity to achieve "immortality" by having a previously unnamed Scottish gorge within the Clan MacLeod territory on the Isle of Skye named after them (or a family member), and for the newly-named topographical feature to be included within the 2012 Collins Big Road Atlas Britain. The winner of the competition was Coatbridge resident, James Elder, who chose to name the gorge after his late father, Ronnie, who was a lover of the Scottish countryside.
